Yamunotri is only 13 km from Hanumanchatti. But it is better to proceed another 6 km and have the night halt at Janakibaichatti. The journey to Yamunotri is simply breathtaking. High snowcovered peaks all around, glaciers, streams and waterfalls, vibrant gree foliage and the pristine air are a sheer delight to tired city lungs. Yamunotri, 3322 metres above sea level, is located on the western bank of the great peak of Banderpunch (monkey's tail) which is 6315 metres high.
